THE ARTISTS



The **Jasper String Quartet** makes its second appearance this summer on the Honest Brook stage. Formed at Oberlin Conservatory, the Jasper began pursuing a professional career in 2006 while studying with James Dunham, Norman Fischer, and Kenneth Goldsmith as Rice University's Graduate Quartet-in-Residence. The quartet continued its training with the Tokyo String Quartet as

Yale University's Graduate-in-Residence. Winners of the prestigious CMA Cleveland Quartet Award, Philadelphia's Jasper String Quartet is the Professional Quartet in Residence at Temple University's Center for Gifted Young Musicians.

Consisting of violinists J. Freivogel -- brother of Meg and Liz (of the Jupiter String Quartet) -- and Karen Kim*, violist Sam Quintal, and cellist Rachel Henderson Freivogel -- wife of first violinist J. -- Jasper records exclusively for Sono Luminus and has released three highly acclaimed albums - Beethoven Op. 131; The Kernis Project: Schubert; and The Kernis Project: Beethoven. The Jasper swept through the competition circuit, winning grand or first prizes in several, including the Plowman Chamber and the Coleman competitions, Chamber Music Yellow Springs, and the Silver Medal at the Fischhoff Chamber Music Competition. They were also the first ensemble honored with Yale School of Music's Horatio Parker Memorial Prize. After winning their national auditions, they joined the roster of Astral Artists.
